Trinity Church, Princeton, NJ: 800 feet of pews

We were late comers to this project in historical Princeton, NJ. Because of the success we had at Nassau Presbyterian just down the street, the overseers of Trinity chose Keck as their pew and furniture restoration company.

With the help of Architect Philip Scott, KSK Architects, and W.S. Cumby, General Contractor, the project came in just in time for Christmas. December is always a tough month for us.... everybody has to have Christmas.

We refinished all of the wainscot, exterior doors and frames, furniture and of course, all of the pews in the sanctuary and chancel.

Once again we worked with a new pew manufacturer, combining talents to accomplish extending the chancel choir seating with ornate canopy, replicating chancel pews and other woodwork. Making new oak look like refinished 1930's oak is a real challenge.









Once again, all of the trades got jammed up at the end, so it was difficult working around floor finishers, finish carpenters and lastly cleanup crews. But we finished on time and Trinity celebrated a joyous Christmas program.
